## **AILDI Language Vitality Workshop:**

## Summary

The participants received a hardcopy version of the survey deployed in their respective communities and used this workshop to report on the results. This was the first real opportunity to exercise the skills acquired in quantitative and qualitative analysis using real survey data. A detailed evaluation of the survey was discussed and strengths, weaknesses, and the survey's overall effectiveness was assessed. Discussion included logistics of the survey, questions that did not work or need to be refined, data management. The group discussed indepth the pros and cons of having on-line surveys or hard copies. The group also discussed how they wanted to share their survey experiences with other tribal communities. The one-day workshop was held at the University of Arizona.
